City of Centennial Counts Census 2010

More than 37,000 households in the City of Centennial will each be receiving a Census 2010 questionnaire during the month of March. When the questionnaires arrive, we hope each household will take ownership of the 2010 Census, make a conscious decision to participate, know where to go for assistance and be ready to answer the questions and mail the questionnaire back as soon as possible.

"The stakes are very high for the 2010 Census," said Cent-ennial Mayor Cathy Noon. "It is our first Census since incorporation and will better establish and define our City and its residents."

Centennial was established in 2001 with an estimated population of 103,000 people. This population over 100,000 is important for receiving state and federal funds as an "entitlement" city. Every person

counted means more money for schools, roads and senior services. As an example, in 2009, the City was awarded \$922,000 by the Department of Energy based on the estimated population (over 100,000) as one of Colorado's largest cities.

The City of Centennial Wants To Remind All Citizens That Coyotes Are In The Area

Centennial has received calls and reports of sightings within the City and citizens need to be aware of their presence.

The City of Centennial does not have a volunteer program but is working with WildEarth Guardians' volunteers to provide information about how to coexist with coyotes. WildEarth Guardians protects and restores wildlife, wild rivers, and wild places in the American West. http://www.wildearthguardians.org.

Your assistance is needed to distribute educational information to neighborhoods and greenbelt areas identified as coyote "hot spots". Whistles will be available to be handed out to citizens for use as a possible hazing tool.

Census 2010, continued from front page

Census figures help determine the number of seats each state has in the U.S. House of Representatives. In the 2000 Census, Colorado gained one seat. State legislative districts are redrawn after each census to ensure equal representation.

The Census Questionnaire is easy to fill out. There are ten questions that should take about ten minutes to answer. The completed questionnaire must be mailed back by April 1st. None of the information you provide will be available to any other government agency. In fact, information from the Census is kept absolutely confidential for 70 years after it is gathered.

From May to June, 2010, census workers will follow-up with households that did not return a questionnaire. In 2000, 77 percent of the households in Arapahoe County returned their questionnaires by mail in the allotted time. Census workers will have official identification when they are collecting this information. Be sure to ask for ID. The Census form will provide numbers to Telephone Questionnaire Assistance (TQA) where operators will answer questions and provide translation in at least six languages. Questionnaire Assistance Centers (QAC) will be established throughout Centennial in public places like grocery or retail stores, recreation centers, libraries, and some local government buildings. These centers will be staffed by paid clerks for 15 hours a week.

The 2010 Census is so important to Centennial that the City developed a marketing plan for the Centennial Census. This ad is among the marketing pieces.

Coyotes In The Area, continued from front page

The Reason Why:

Coyotes are adaptable predators and are common in urban areas. They are tolerant of human activities, and adapt and adjust rapidly to changes in their environment. During the winter and early spring, the coyotes are mating and finding den sites while establishing their territory in the process. It is crucial to remove all food sources from your yard, place deterrents, and haze (reinstill the natural fear of humans into the coyotes).

Coyotes are watching and learning from us; we influence their behavior, and it will be our actions that determine what the young coyotes learn. We want the new generation of coyotes to be naturally afraid of humans and not find our neighborhoods or back yards to be a safe place to live.

If you haven't already done so, please talk with your children and neighbors about wildlife. Remind them not to approach or feed any wildlife and teach them what to do if wildlife approaches them:

- Stop, do not run.
- Face the animal and try to look big (put arms over your head).
- In a firm voice, tell the animal "Go Away!"
- Slowly back out of the area and go tell an adult.

The City of Centennial City Council Approved An Ordinance

The City of Centennial City Council unanimously approved an ordinance to develop a program to evaluate performance measurements at the Monday, February 1 Council Meeting. This ordinance was brought forwarded by District 4 City Council Member **Todd Miller.** City Council embraced the principles of setting a foundation and culture of performance excellence within the City of Centennial. This ordinance will:

- Establish the critical importance of performance measurement and reporting for accomplishing effective and efficient delivery of City services to residents of Centennial
- Increase confidence of Centennial citizens in the competence of City government by systematically holding City departments accountable for efficiently achieving program results
- Strengthen public accountability by requiring City departments to continue to measure program performance against goals and objectives, and report publicly on their progress
- Improve the City's measurement, monitoring, and reporting of results achieved by programs supported with federal/state funds, to ensure that funding source performance requirements are met and that funds are spent to achieve measureable results that support the City's goals.

In 2010, the City staff will work to improve program efficiency and effectiveness by properly aligning and linking the City Council's priorities, budgeting, and assessment processes to provide adequate information on program performance. Performance measurement and reporting systems are the basis for providing accountability to the public, determining whether quality services are being provided at a reasonable cost, facilitating City Council decision making and communication with citizens, improving City management and service delivery, and enhancing citizens' understanding of government performance.

Centennial Received Two Awards

The City of Centennial received two awards at the 2009 American Public Works Association (APWA) Colorado Chapter Annual Luncheon. Centennial was recognized in the category of Public Works Administration for Innovative Customer Service Call Center and the category of Engineering/Construction Management for infrastructure improvements supporting the Streets at SouthGlenn Redevelopment project.



COMMUNITY SPEAKS, DISTRICT LISTENS

The recent Cherry Creek School District Community Forums, held in December and January at Overland, Smoky Hill and Cherry Creek high schools, allowed parents, staff and community members to express what was important to themselves and their students. Three themes that parents repeatedly echoed were the quality of the learning environments, community connections and the assurance that schools were trying to meet the unique needs of

their children. In March, work will begin on a draft of the District Improvement Plan. It will be presented to the board for adoption in May. Electronic versions of the plan will be ready for distribution to staff and the public in June.

WORK BEGINS ON INSTITUTE, INSIDE AND OUT

On January 25, the Cherry Creek Schools community broke ground on the Institute for Science and Technology, an \$18 million facility that is being built on the Overland High School and Prairie Middle School campus. The Institute will serve 6th through 12th graders, offering a curriculum focused on science, technology, engineering and math. Students in the Overland feeder area will have first priority for admittance into the Institute. Remaining spots will be filled with students from throughout the district. The school is scheduled to open in the fall of 2011. Funding for the building was approved by voters in the November 2008 bond issue.


